


PAWSOX BOY SCOUT SLEEPOVER PRESENTED BY KNOX TRAIL COUNCIL FAQ and ITINERARY

Question: Is it assigned seating or open seating for the game?

Answer: Great question! We have open seating available in the **General Admission** or in the **Bleacher** seats. See the diagram below. What many packs do is coordinate before the game and determine where people will meet, sit, and if anyone is coming late that may need seats held for them. This way, each pack can determine how they want to participate in the event.
