Upcoming Overnight Training Events Cancelled

Important message from the Mayflower Council Training Team

Because of the ongoing concern over the Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE) virus, the Council Training Team will NOT be running the Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) course that was scheduled for September 27-28 at Camp Resolute or the Basic Adult Leaders Outdoor Orientation (BALOO) course that was scheduled for October 5-6 at Camp Squanto.

Overnight camping and outdoor activities are an integral part of the required curriculum for both of these training courses, and after considering the long-range weather forecast, the Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE) risk map, and feedback from many sources, we determined that we're not comfortable with the risk that these activities pose. Mayflower Council Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE) Virus Information post.

For now, we're keeping the October 19-20 Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) course in Wrentham open, as there's a better chance of a mosquito-killing frost before 10/19.

We will re-evaluate the risk as we get closer to the course dates.

Course directors will notify registered participants for the September Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) and October Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO) courses and provide options for rescheduling.

We will add capacity to the October 19-20 Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) course and look for a later date for Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO). We will also offer these courses again in the spring. Paid participants (those from out of council) can receive full refunds. We apologize for the inconvenience but appreciate your understanding as we seek to take reasonable precautions to keep all members of our Scouting family safe.

Cub Scout Leader Training Fall 2019

What's Required

All registered adult leaders must take Youth Protection Training (YPT) online or in person and renew it every two years. Den Leaders and Cubmasters must also take Hazardous Weather training. These courses are online at <u>https://my.scouting.org</u>.

To be considered trained for your position, and entitled to wear the "Trained" patch, you must take **Position-Specific Training** for your role (Den Leader, Cubmaster, Committee Member, etc.). You can do it online or in person (see below). Also, if your pack goes camping, at least one leader on the trip must be **BALOO**-trained.

In-Person Course Descriptions

Position-Specific Training (PST): Learn about your role; pick up new skills, program ideas, activities, and resources; and share tips with other leaders. This is now a 4-hour course with combined sessions as well as separate tracks for Den Leaders, Cubmasters/Assistants, and Pack Committee. If you take it in person, you can skip the online PST, which is just as long (and lonelier).

Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO): A day-and-a half introduction to the skills needed to plan and run Cub Scout outdoor activities—and the policies that help keep them safe. Learn about the fun you can have outdoors! This course includes camping overnight in a tent, along with hands-on practice in fire-building, outdoor cooking, knots, program planning, and other camping skills.

District Committee Position-Specific Training is now online! Starting this fall, you can now earn your "Trained" status online at <u>https://my.scouting.org</u>.

Reminder: Youth Protection Training (YPT) is on a two-year cycle. Our council follows the national standard. If you last took YPT in 2018, you'll need to renew it in 2020.

Hazardous Weather Training is the only thing standing between many of our "direct contact" leaders and the "Trained" patch. (It shows up as SCO_800 in unit training records.) It's only available at <u>https://my.scouting.org</u>. The BSA has not authorized an in-person version.

Making Sense of Training Records

We get a lot of questions about training records. Here are a few answers and tips:

- Every adult leader's official training record is the BSA's national database, called "ScoutNet."
- <u>https://my.scouting.org</u> is the way to see your official training record. Log in with your account.
- If your unit uses "Scoutbook" software, your training record in Scoutbook will NOT automatically match the official ScoutNet database. The BSA says they're working on making an automated connection eventually. Until then, update Scoutbook on your own.
- Your unit's "key three" can view and fix records in My.Scouting for all leaders in the unit. They can also designate a few more people to have this access. Visit https://filestore.scouting.org/filestore/idg/Security_Man ager.pdf for instructions on delegating access.

If you took a training course but it's not showing up in your record, this could be happening for several reasons:

- Software glitch or multiple My.Scouting accounts
- Took training long ago, before there was a database
- Took training but it wasn't entered into database
- Took training with another council who didn't send us the records

A member of your unit "key three" can fix your record. Your district training chair can also help. Please show a copy of your training card or certificate to get credit.

CPR/AED for Professional Rescuers (CPR Pro) Added to Schedule

"CPR Pro" is a more advanced version of the CPR training that our volunteer Red Cross-certified trainers typically offer. We've added courses on May 31 and June 22 and will likely add another later in the summer. This training is good for a two-year certification. Registration is open through www.mavflowerbsa.org. CPR Pro is especially useful for two groups of people:

- · Summer camp waterfront staff.
- Anyone seeking BSA Lifeguard certification, which requires you to "Show evidence of current training in American Red Cross First Aid and American Red Cross CPR/AED for the Professional Rescuer or equivalent."

Youth Protection Training Revised Don't worry; this is <u>not</u> a new requirement. But we do want you to be aware.

On March 1, the BSA updated its official online youth protection training (YPT) course. It includes policies and procedures implemented since the last revision in February 2018, as well as four new optional modules for anyone who would like to become better at recognizing and dealing with violence, physical abuse, emotional abuse, and neglect. When we offer in-person YPT, we will cover the required parts of the new training.

If you have a valid YPT completion, it's still good for two years. You <u>do not</u> need to retake this new course right away. But we do want you to be aware that anyone who takes YPT from now on will be taking the new version and it's there for anyone else who wants to learn more.

Important: Online Youth Protection Update

Information about online Youth Protection Training:

At the end of February, the online Youth Protection Course will be replaced with an updated version. Help spread the word to all leaders that any courses in progress (completions of some but not all of the required four modules) will be lost when the course is updated. For example, if a leader had completed one, two, or three of the four modules, but had not completed all four, their completed modules will be erased and they will have to start over again to complete all four required modules. You must have completed all four modules successfully by February 28th, as the new Learning Plan will be launched March 1, 2019.

If you have started-but not completed-the current Y01 (YPT-2) Youth Protection Training:

You must complete the training before March 1, 2019, or any progress you have made will not transfer, due to the new learning plan. Otherwise, you may simply start over with the new training plan on March 1, 2019.

If you HAVE already completed the current Y01 (YPT-2) Youth Protection Training:

You WILL NOT be affected. You DO NOT have to retake the training when the March 1, 2019 course is released.

This update will include new policies and procedures implemented since the course was first released in February 2018, however our Youth Protection and Health and Safety policies, guidelines and procedures are continually being updated and revised. The on-line version of the Guide to Safe Scouting is the single most up to date source of our commitment to Safe Scouting.

Youth Protection certifications will continue to be valid for a two year period.

When the course update is complete, four new VOLUNTARY modules will be added and will be available under the "VOLUNTARY programs." These include:

- 1. Physical Abuse
- 2. Neglect
- 3. Emotional Abuse
- 4. Witnessing Violence

These new, VOLUNTARY modules will provide leaders with knowledge about other forms of abuse.
