THE PURPOSE OF CUB SCOUTS

The Cub Scouting program has 10 purposes related to the overall mission of the Boy Scouts of America – to build character, learn citizenship, and develop personal fitness:

THE SCOUT OATH

And to obey the Scout Law;
To help other people at all times;

CUB SCOUT DENS

A den is a group of six to eight boys and girls, within the pack, that meets several times a month between pack meetings.

The youth in a den are the same grade level. Units designated as “family” Cub Scout packs have the ability to form “family dens” with boys and girls together in the same den.

The den structure allows youth to build relationships with leaders and others. The den provides opportunities for activities that would be difficult with a large group. The den also provides leadership opportunities for the youth.

CUB SCOUT PACK MEETINGS

The monthly pack meeting brings together all dens, their leaders, and their families, to participate in a large-scale event that serves as a showcase for everything the Scouts have learned and done in their individual den meetings.

The pack meeting gives the youth a larger experience beyond their own den, and helps them to connect their individual activities to the entire Cub Scouting program.

HOW DOES THE PROGRAM WORK?



SCOUTING THROUGH VOLUNTEERS

Scouting is a Volunteer-led, Family Experience. It is only through family involvement that the Scouting program can be delivered.

Over the course of the year, each family will be asked to help with different projects.

Some of the most fun and important volunteers serve as Den Leaders and help coordinate and lead the regular den meetings.

OUTSIDE ACTIVITIES

Scouting does not just happen at pack and den meetings. Regular special events keep Scouts plugged in and provide opportunities use the skills Scouts have learned.

Events are typically offered monthly. They include:

- Hikes and Campouts
- Field Trips and Family Activities
- Cub Adventure Days
- Community Service Projects
- Webelos Woods
- Pinewood Derbies
- “Cub-O-Ree”s

LION BOBCAT



The Lion Rank is for youth in kindergarten or age 6. To earn the Lion badge, a Scout must complete five required adventures.



After Lions, the Bobcat badge is the first rank Cub Scouts earn before they advance to the rank of Tiger, Wolf, Bear, or Webelos.

The Bobcat requirements include:

Learn and say the Cub Scout motto, the Scout Oath, and the Scout Law and tell what they mean;

Show the Cub Scout sign, salute, and handshake and tell what they mean;

With your parent or guardian complete the exercises in the pamphlet *How to Protect Your Children from Child Abuse: A Parent's Guide*.

ADVANCEMENT



TIGER WOLF BEAR



The Tiger rank is for youth who are in first grade or are age 7. To earn the Tiger badge, a Scout must complete six required adventures with their den or family and one elective adventure of the den or family's choosing.



The Wolf rank is for youth who have finished first grade (or who are 8 years old). To earn the Wolf badge, a Scout must complete six required adventures and one elective adventure.



The Bear rank is for youth who have finished second grade (or who are 9 years old). To earn the Bear badge, a Scout must complete six required adventures and one elective adventure.

WEBELOS ARROW OF LIGHT



Webelos dens are for youth who have completed third grade (or reached age 10). Webelos Scouts get to work on the five required Webelos adventures and choose two of the 18 elective adventures that are shared by the Webelos and Arrow of Light ranks.



The highest rank in Cub Scouting is the Arrow of Light. Earning this rank prepares a Webelos Scout to join a Troop. Scouts must complete four required adventures and three elective adventures to earn the Arrow of Light rank.

SCOUT REGISTRATION

The Boy Scouts' National Council charges \$80 per year to be a Scout plus the Mayflower Council charges a \$48 program activity fee.

All youth joining for the first time pay a one time Joining Fee of \$25.

Scouts joining pay \$153
(Covers 12 months)

Families may subscribe to Scout Life magazine for \$15.00 per year.

Subscribers receive a monthly magazine addressed to the Scout showing Scouts in action and Scout Skills. Scout Life encourages Scouts to read for fun.

REGISTRATION ASSISTANCE

We believe Scouting should be available to all families. Assistance is available in case of financial hardship or need.

Registration assistance may be requested from the Mayflower Council through your Cub Scout Pack.

"Camperships" (camp/activity scholarships) may be requested directly by families using the Campership form on the council website mayflowerbsa.org.

FUNDRAISING

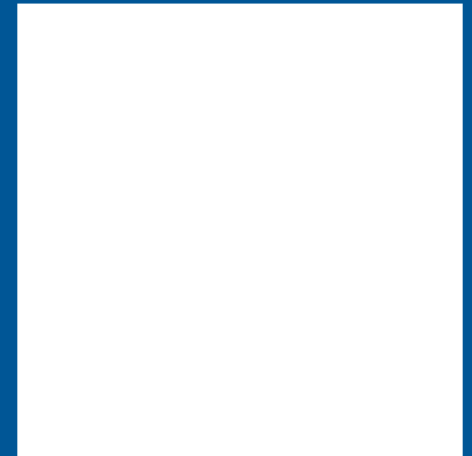
Scouts are encouraged to fundraise to help pay for their adventures and experiences. Fundraising allows youth to learn the value of hard work and taking ownership of their program.
