The Cranberry Harbors District Advancement Team has been working to put a temporary fix in place for Project Proposals and Eagle Scout Rank Board of Reviews while the world works through the Corona Virus outbreak. This fix is temporary and will be discontinued as soon as possible. We believe that the live face to face meeting is better than the online conversation. This procedure may be adjusted at any time.

We have a plan to perform Project Proposal reviews and Eagle Scout Rank Board of Review through a live online meeting. We need each Scout to provide us the information we will need in advance of the meeting. We are listing the information we need, no more and no less. If a Project Proposal or final Eagle Project comes in with the unnecessary pages, we find it does not open properly and slows down the process.

Project Proposal Review:

The Proposal must be the Eagle Scout Service Project Workbook Form No. 512-927 dated January 2019 or later. This form is available from www.MayflowerBSA.org website under Program then Youth. This will give you the latest version of the form. Download the form and then disconnect from the website before attempting to edit the form. The Scout must email their Project Proposal to Cranberryharborsadvancement@MayflowerBSA.org. The Project Proposal must be in the form of a 300dpi PDF.

We want the following pages sent to us. We need the cover page. We do not want pages 2 thru A. We need pages B thru E. We need the scanned copy of Page E with signatures. If electronic signatures are applied then we request an email from the beneficiary or troop leadership confirming the electronic signature.

We will contact you with our availability to meet. We will send you an email with an online meeting invitation. You should log in to the meeting with a parent and we will try to keep two adults logged in the meet the Youth Protection requirements.









Eagle Scout Final Project and Eagle Scout Rank Board of Review:

The Eagle Scout Rank Application is Form 512-728 January 2020 Printing. This form is available from <u>WWW.MayflowerBSA.org</u> website under Program then Youth. This Application is filled out after all requirements are completed but must be done before the 18th birthday. This Application is scanned and sent to eaglescoutapplicationsubmission@mayflowerbsa.org. Council will verify the dates of the Merit Badges and Rank advancement then send the Application to the District Advancement Team.

To schedule the Eagle Scout Rank Board of Review, the District Advancement Team must be contacted. The Scout must send the following pages from their finalized Eagle Scout Service Project Workbook; Cover page, Project Proposal Page B thru signed Page E, Project Plan Page A thru Fundraising Application Page A. Project Final Report Cover sheet thru Page C. Scan a copy of Page C with signatures. If electronic signatures are applied then we request an email from the beneficiary or troop leadership confirming the electronic signature.

We will schedule your Eagle Scout Board of Review. We will send you and your Scoutmaster an email with an online meeting invitation. You and the Scoutmaster will each log in to the meeting and the Advancement Team will log in to hold your Board. We will ask you to log out for ten or fifteen minutes to allow the Board to deliberate then you will log in again and we will give you the outcome of the Board.
