Safety Moment: *Driver's Pledge*

RISK ZONE DRIVER'S PLEDGE



- ▶ **I will not** text or talk on my phone while I am driving. Texting and talking take my eyes off the road, hands off the steering wheel, and my mind off what I am doing.
- ▶ **I will** put my phone in my backpack or in the glove box before I get behind the wheel. I will only check it when I have safely parked the vehicle.
- ▶ **I will not** become distracted by things going on inside and outside the vehicle. I will concentrate on my driving and my travel plans.
- ▶ **I will not** drive when I feel fatigued. I realize that when I am fatigued, I process information more slowly and less accurately and this impairs my ability to react in time to avoid accidents.
- ▶ **I will** arrange my schedule so that several days before a Scout “driving trip,” I will get a good night’s sleep every night to avoid the cumulative effect of not getting enough sleep.
- ▶ **I will** make trip preparations far enough in advance so that last-minute preparations don’t interfere with my rest.
- ▶ **I will** make travel plans and drive only during the part of the day when I know I will be alert.
- ▶ **I will** be smart about engaging in physical activities during Scouting outings and will make sure that I will be ready to drive alertly.

- Size/shape of foil ball

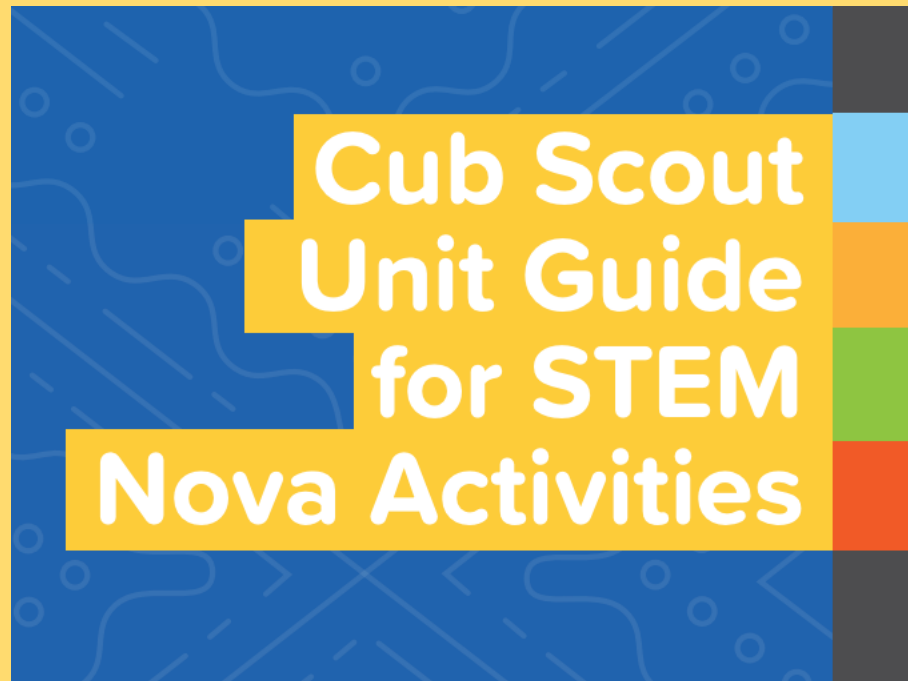

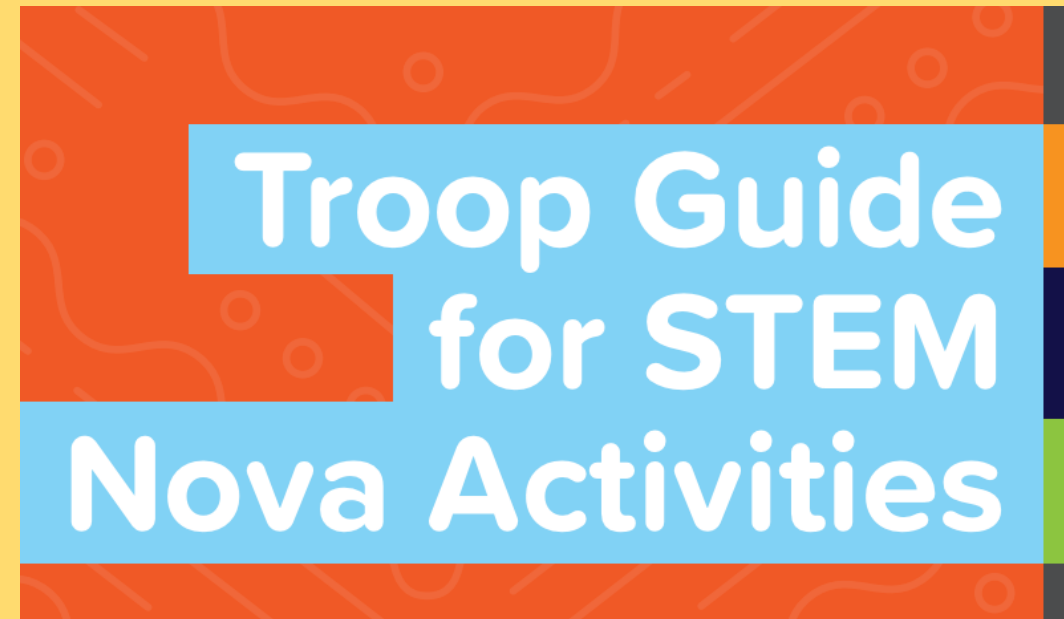

Roundtable Preference Survey Results

- Scouters asked to rank 3 choices:

- 188 individuals polled, 51 valid responses
(48% Troop, 30% Pack, 17% Multiple, 5% District/Council)

Roundtable Survey Comments:

Why “Almost Never” attend?

- Just taking over as cubmaster, but after 7 yrs in pack leadership roles, I’ve only ever attended one, and it was a colossal waste of my time, especially to do in person.
- because they are scheduled the same night as our troop meetings and they are usually a waste of time
- Conflict with another scout event
- Will be among for monthly if the stay virtual
- Schedule always conflicts with childrens' sports practices



Roundtable Survey Comments:

Why “Almost Never” unit represented?

- I used to go when I was committee chair of a pack and I found it to be 98% a waste of time, almost nothing is ever said or done that couldn't be done in a 5 minute Powerpoint presentation
- Some of my units attend more regularly than others



Roundtable Survey Comments:

Other comments / suggestions (1)

- Scouting is a volunteer activity, and overall BSA presents too many bureaucratic processes on top of the actual pack operations- council should make things easier, not more time consuming, for pack leader volunteers. Goals of council should be MINIMAL time involvement... zooms should be far and away the preferred mtg. Also, all training should be virtual, and short, with minimal need for in person- the world has changed and BSA needs to change too. For example, it's almost impossible to get a parent volunteer to do BALOO as it requires sacrificing an entire weekend. It's really ridiculous. Yet, we are not supposed to camp without BALOO training. So guess what happens in that situation... packs don't have anyone BALOO trained at camping.
- Thank you for all you do!
- Thank you for all you do!
- Although I do like the idea of getting back to in person meetings, the hybrid option of attending virtually seems like a must so thank you for that
- The goal should be access to information and fellowship.
- It would be great if the slides could be sent several days ahead of the RT as a pre-read. This would likely generate more discussion since everyone will have had the chance to review and think about the content.
- Prefer Live Sessions
- Keep up the great work we appreciate all your related efforts.
- Change start time to 7:30

Other comments / suggestions (2)

- I am not opposed to donating money for various reasons but don't believe it is necessary for Roundtable when virtual meeting is possible. There seems to be a small group that uses this for their social life, and though that is fine, the focus should be on youth development not adult social life or reminiscing about the old days. It can be overwhelming for newer people or those who are in it just for the youth when the adults are the focus. Nothing against promoting friendship, fellowship and collaboration, if it feels inclusive of all levels of involvement, but often it doesn't. It has been portrayed online that the format isn't ideal; I don't think it's a problem. I get lots of great info to inform the Troop and that's what's important.
- Have more than one person talking for the first 45 mins. Would be nice to see other RT commissioners involved in the whole meeting not just the breakouts.
- I'm happy with the current meeting formats
- If you HAVE to do it, do it via Zoom please! If you don't have to do it put it in a monthly document and share that electronically
- Keep up the good work!
- Being virtual is really hard. All the camaraderie is being lost. The power point presentations are just not interactive. Why go if the slides can just be viewed online. At this point Roundtable, minus breakout sessions could just be emailing the powerpoint slides and calling it done. Just like training works best in person, Roundtable works best in person with interaction between the adults. I attend because I feel an obligation but find powerpoint for so many months has just become too much.



Roundtable Survey Comments:

Other comments / suggestions (2)

- Having a virtual option is key - thank you for including the virtual livestream option in all scenarios. Separately - the principle of one of the elementary schools in Marshfield is a Scouter. If the middle school is no longer an option, the elementary school might be (it's across the street from the fairgrounds). Lastly, our charter Org, the Boys and Girls Club in Marshfield would almost certainly allow round tables (at least a few times a year if not every month) for free.
- Just my personal opinion, but I think overall engagement is down with any virtual offering. I wouldn't even continue to juggle all of the logistics to provide the option - people will come back. North River is a great location - carpeted rooms are much easier to hear than a school cafeteria. Right off the highway. Our Pack (105 Pembroke) meets there for pack meetings. The screen can be dropped at the front of the room, you just need to bring your own projector/computer - but much easier in that space to have a multimedia presentation, than the school caf. You may even be able to use a few classrooms for OA, eagle boards, etc.
- The only thing that deters me from attending in person can be family obligations and/or distance. Between scouts, coaching sports, etc I'm already gone a significant amount of time. While meetings are only once per month, it's still one additional night away from the kids/family. The focus becomes -is the value I get worth it? For some sessions yes, some no to be pretty honest.
- Our troop meets every Wednesday, so it's inconvenient for our leaders to attend round table. Advances in technology allow for Zoom meetings with no expense and allows more folks to attend. As a nonprofit, there ought to be a place that will allow meetings at no expense.

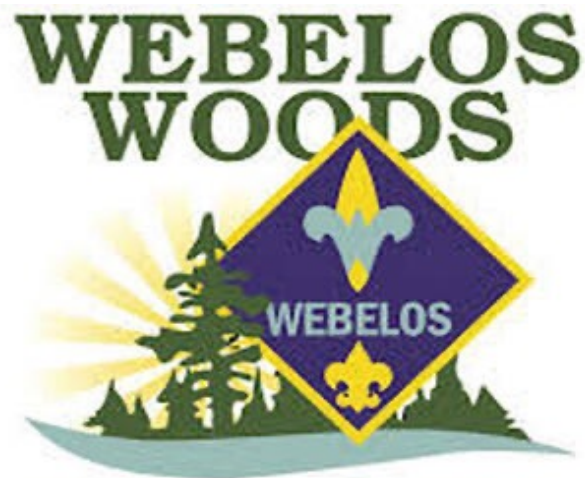
