OUTDOOR LEARNING IS HEALTHY

Young people need to be well. To get the most from life, one must be mentally and physically fit. For centuries, a commitment to physical wellness has been reflected in Scouting's outdoor programs such as hiking, camping, swimming, climbing, and conservation. Outdoor learning is active, increasing physical, mental, and social health. According to many researchers, including the American Psychological Association, exposure to nature has been linked to a host of benefits, like improved attention, lower stress, better mood, reduced risk of psychiatric disorders, and even upticks in empathy and cooperation. Benefits such as increased happiness, subjective well-being, positive affect, positive social interactions, a sense of meaning and purpose in life, and decreases in mental distress have also been documented.

LEARNING PERSONALIZED

It is no secret that Scouting is an educational based program that follows children through their interests. This model encourages and nurtures the curiosity of our youth from an early age. Children in our program have access to a wide range of topics typically not covered in K-12, such as dentistry, nuclear science, movie making, etc. Ultimately, our youth learn that it is okay to be curious, and there is more than one way to acquire knowledge.

SERVICE TO OTHERS – SAVING LIVES

It is true that when service to others is typically mentioned in Scouting, our youth's countless community service hours are highlighted. But beyond traditional community service hours, service to others for Scouts look something like this:


- Having the skills necessary to help save a life through CPR
- Saving a choking friend by successfully performing the Heimlich maneuver
- Rescuing drowning individuals & so much more

Knowing how to administer aid is a critical component of what we do. While we frequently think of first aid in the context of treating sprains and rashes on Scouting adventures, Scouts continue to translate those skills even when they aren't in uniform.
