Boost Your Outdoor Skills

April 14 is the deadline to register for **Introduction to Backpacking** (April 27-28). This new course is ideal for adult leaders who'd like to build skills and confidence to take their Scouts backpacking.

Registration is also open for **Beyond the Basics** (June 15). Adult leaders can join us at Camp Squanto for a "choose your own adventure" with opportunities to learn advanced rope skills, orienteering, cooking, woods tools, etc., from experienced Scouters. It's a great chance to build skills beyond what we teach at BALOO and IOLS.

Calling All Youth Leaders!

Coming this summer: a fun six-day overnight course filled with team-building activities, content sessions, and a patrol outpost. We're running National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) at Camp Squanto and Camp Resolute for youth in Scouts BSA, Venturing, and Sea Scouts. Participants work together in patrols to develop skills in decision making, planning, communication, and cooperation in a model unit. These skills are key to success in any youth-led unit. District Committee Training

Did you know the BSA has "position-specific" training for district committee members? This training will go online soon, but for now, the best way to earn it is in person. If you missed our workshop in January, come to the next edition on May 4 in Marlborough! Registration is open.

"Leave No Trace" Training, Explained

- **Awareness** training can run from 30 minutes to a full day. The BSA has online resources and a "Leave No Trace 101" curriculum, or a session can be customized. If you're signing off on outdoor ethics advancement, or you're an Outdoor Ethics Guide (youth position in a troop), take this level of training.
- **Trainer** training is a two-day course. Our council offers it in May and September. This training is recommended for anyone teaching Leave No Trace in a formal session.
- **Master Educator** is a five-day course. Master educators develop expertise and become qualified to teach LNT Trainer courses and more.

A training course for youth leaders

National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) is a fun, 6-day consecutive leadership training course for youth in the BSA. NYLT centers around the concepts of what a leader must *be*, must *know*, and must *do*. The course takes place in an outdoor setting, and models the life of a troop, with patrols, content sessions, team-building activities, challenges, and a patrol outpost. Our youth staff creates a positive learning experience and delivers content from national to participants. NYLT works to give people the skills they need to effectively perform in their home units, but also in their everyday life as an individual, and in groups. NYLT is a key training for any youth-led unit. As our staff likes to say, “if you can see it, you can be it!”

Eligibility Requirements: 13 years old and completed 8th grade, and 1st Class Scout, Venturer, or Sea Scout. Scoutmaster or Crew Advisor Approval. Young women in Scouts BSA do not need to fulfill the 1st Class requirement.

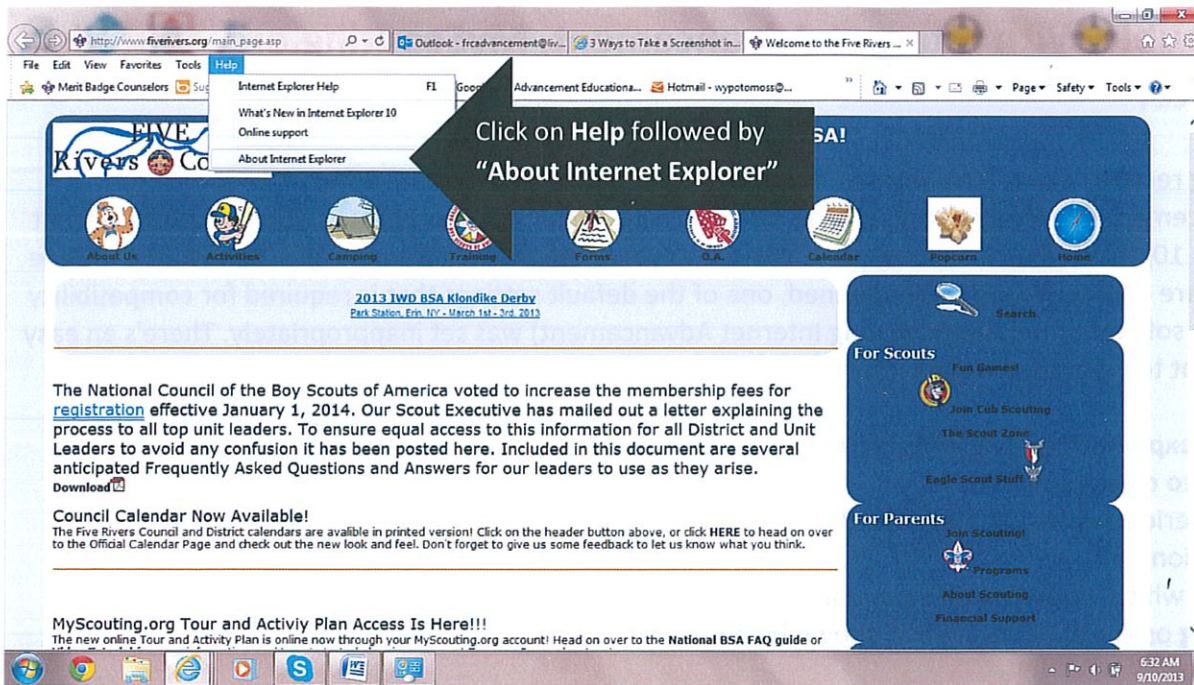
Having Trouble With Internet Advancement, MyScouting.org, Unit Visit Tracking, etc?

If you are having recently-started troubles or are experiencing problems with the BSA online web sites (Internet Advancement, MyScouting.org, or Unit Visit Tracking, etc.) it may be because you are using Internet Explorer Version 10, which may have been downloaded to your computer "automatically" as part of a routine Microsoft software update. When this happened, one of the default settings that is required for compatibility with several BSA software modules (including Internet Advancement) was set inappropriately. There's an easy fix and I'll attempt to walk you through it by using screen pics from the computer.

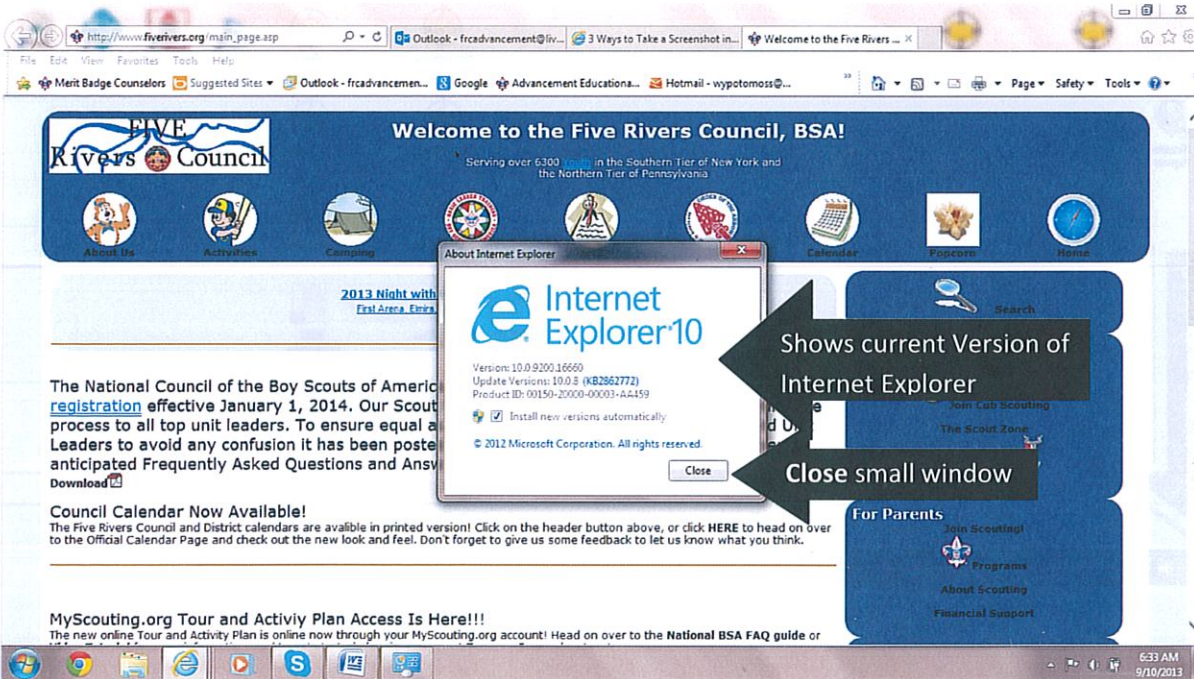
- 1.) If you're not experiencing problems, you're probably not running Internet Explorer Version 10 and need to do nothing.
- 2.) If you are experiencing issues, you'll need to verify that you are, in fact, using Internet Explorer Version 10.
- 3.) To determine which Version you're running you'll need to launch/open Internet Explorer by double clicking on the Explorer Icon as shown below.



- 4.) After opening Internet Explorer click on the **Help button/icon** as show below followed by clicking on **"About Internet Explorer"**. This should provide you with the Version of Internet Explorer that you're currently running.



Click on Help followed by "About Internet Explorer"

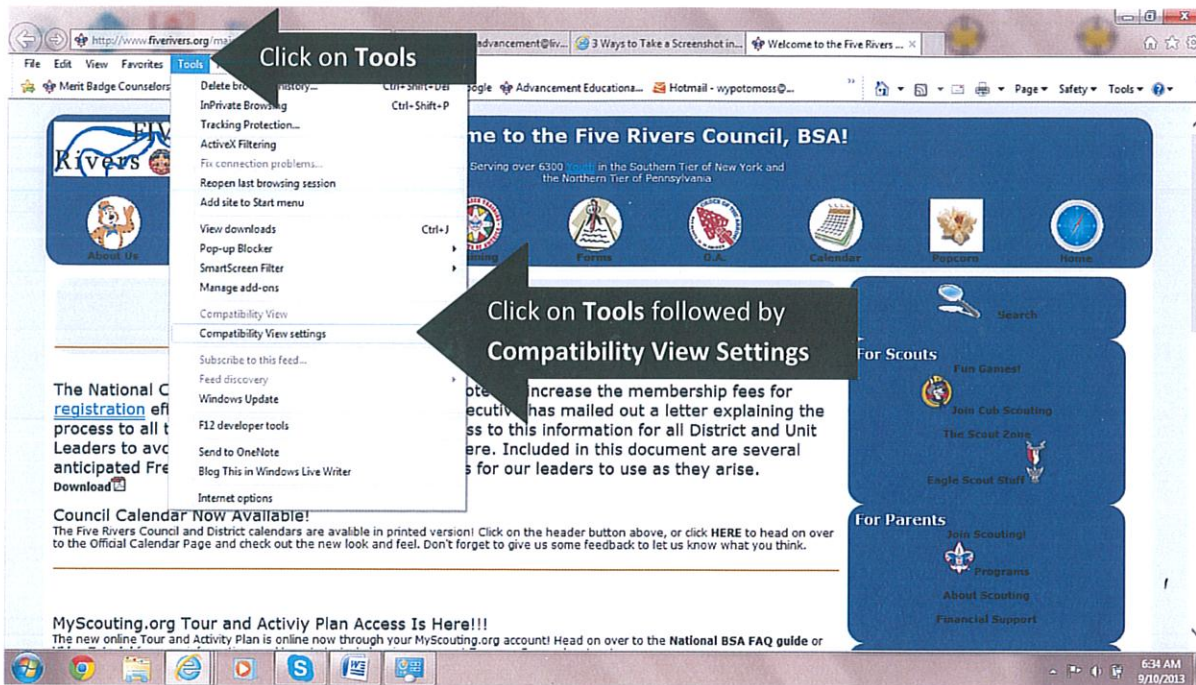


Shows current Version of Internet Explorer

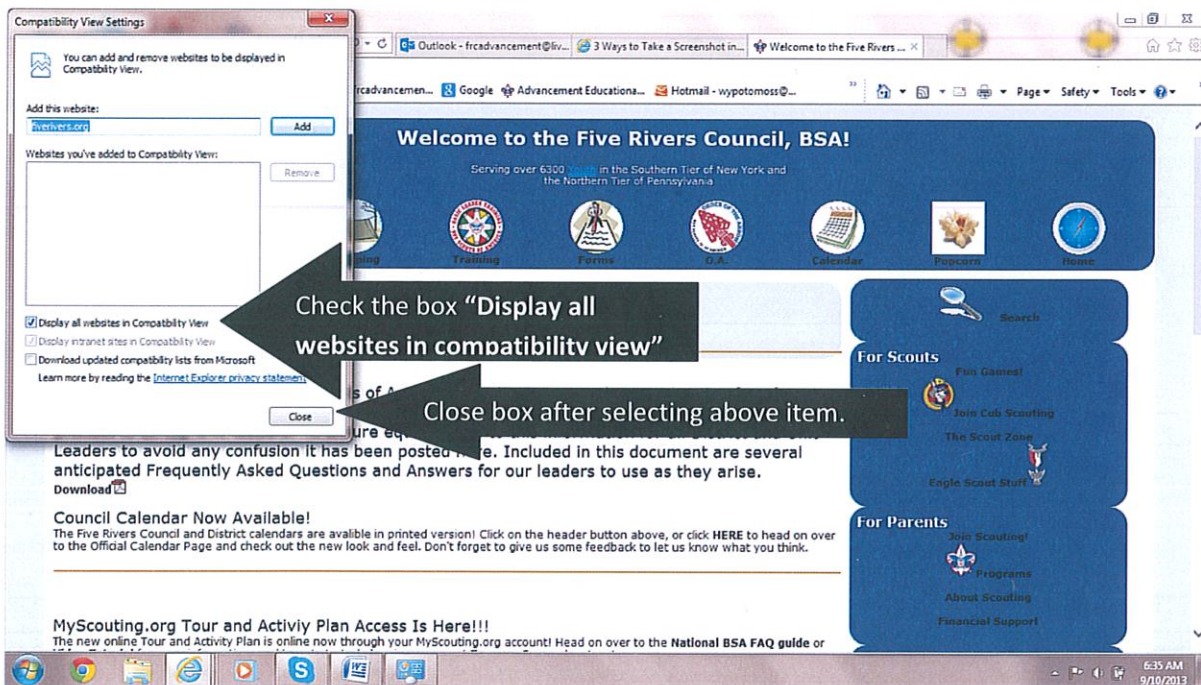

5.) As seen above, this computer is running Internet Explorer 10 and thus will need the following change to be compatible with BSA software modules. **If your computer is running something other than Internet Explorer 10 no changes should be necessary.**

6.) To make the necessary changes for compatibility with Internet Explorer 10 and BSA, close the small window. Open the **Tools** pull down menu followed by clicking the **Compatibility View Settings** as seen below.



7.) Check the box "Display all websites in compatibility view".



8.) After completing this action, click the **Close** button as shown above.

9.) You must then close Internet Explorer and re-launch it in order for this action to take effect.

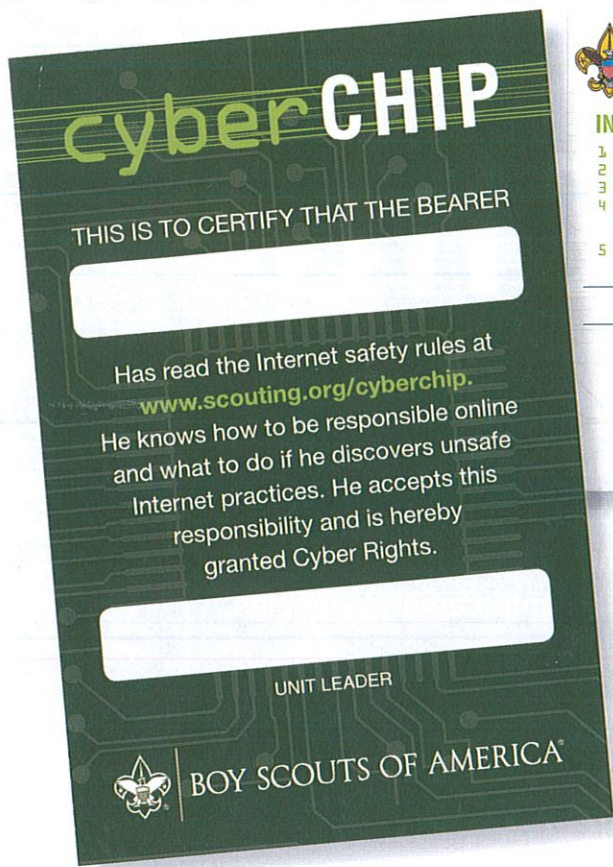

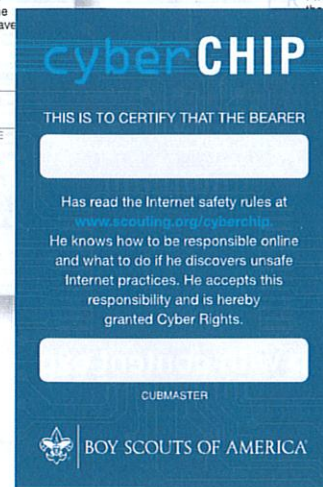

The Cyber Chip is under consideration as a requirement in merit badges and more.

Integration Ideas

Councils and Districts

- Add Cyber Chip information to council or district websites. Create a continually updated area focused on cyber safety—maybe “Did You Know?” “Fun Facts,” or “Top Five.”
- Spread the word by communicating at events like camporees and Scoutoramas and by providing fun cyber games.
- Do a tech challenge event for adults or youth—then set teams to compete with each other on their knowledge in a fun fashion.

June is Cyber Safety Month
Plan a lock-in or electronics campout. Include fun, food, games, education, stories, videos, and more.

Unit Leaders

- Tailor the requirements to your own unit rules. Complete the requirements for the Cyber Chip as a unit at a regular meeting, then hand out the cards and patches on the spot.
- Create a fun challenge for youth to stump the unit leaders.
- Play a “Jeopardy!”-style game in a meeting to use what's been learned.
- Play relay race or games with Tech Challenge.
- Host a panel of experts to answer all your youths' and adults' “how-to” questions.
- Use the Cyber Chip as a foundational step in preparation for leadership positions such as Webmaster.

Use the Cyber Chip as a tool to work with your youth to create additional open communications.

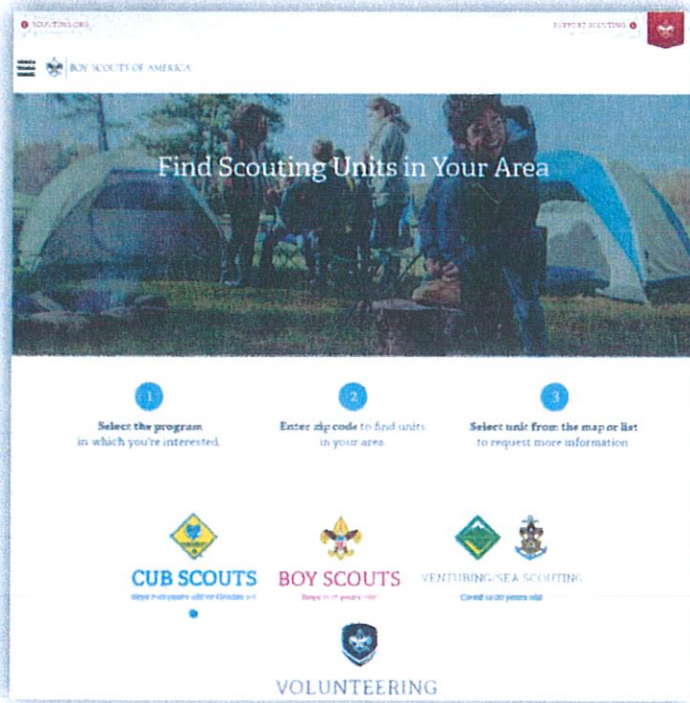

The Facts:

- Online registration is a separate system from BeAScout.org
- You can use the online membership application without ever linking to BeAScout.org
- You can use the online registration lead-collection and follow up tools without linking to BeAScout.org
- BeAScout.org cannot send leads to the online registration system without the unit pin being set up and in unit mode
- BeAScout.org cannot send people to the membership application without the unit pin being set up and both the council and unit activating the “apply now” function
- The legacy/old BeAScout.org lead and application tools will be deactivated once the online registration roll-out is complete
- Councils can totally deactivate certain units so they do not show up on BeAScout.org at all
- Units pins can still be displayed on BeAScout.org (in council mode) without allowing people to submit leads or apply – the pin will then provide the council’s contact information

BeAScout.org is NOT required for using the online registration system.

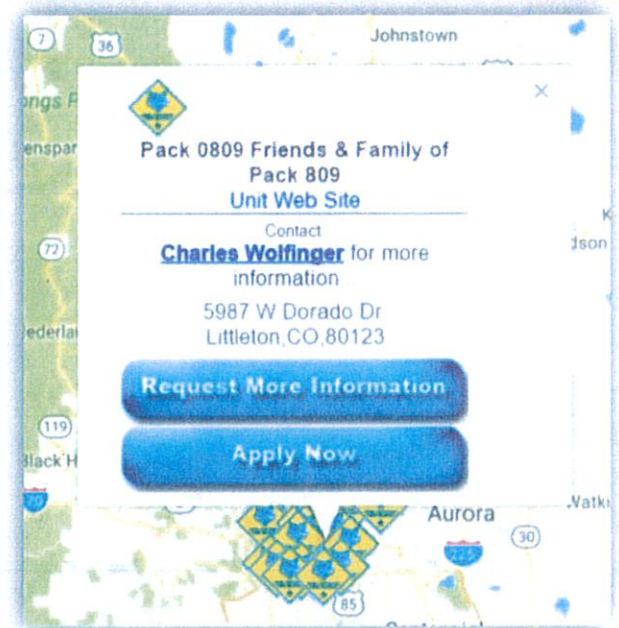
BeAScout.org Pins Status Options:

Deactivated: the pin is never displayed on BeAScout.org

Council Mode: The pin is displayed with basic unit information and the council’s contact information. No “Request More Information” or “Apply Now” button is displayed.

Unit Mode (no application): The pin has been updated and displays the unit information as updated by the unit leaders. It shows the “Request More Information” button, and any leads are sent to the Online Registration – Lead Manager tool

Unit Mode (with application): Same as above, but the council has allowed the applications to be turned on and the unit has activated the application function. The “Apply Now” and “Request More Information” buttons are both displayed. New membership applications will show up in the Online Registration – Application Manager tool



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
