Why games?

- Fun
- Encourage learning, strategic thinking, memory development, becoming a good winner, acceptance of loss, social skill development, empathy and conflict resolution lessons, communication skills, etc.
- Can be individual, or team process
- Can enhance outdoor activities
- Develop motor skills
 - Follow the leader, Simon says, etc.
- May provide an "indoor backup" when needed
 - "Board game" tournaments, "Jeopardy" or Trivia
- Extension of "family game night"







What games

- Internet search will show many Scouting themed games, especially outdoor ones
 - Be wary of "legacy" posts, check prohibited activities listing
 - Don't ignore Cornhole, horseshoes, ladder toss, other "target" games
- "Favorite Game" night (Scouts bring in games, adults supervise)
- Round-robin tournaments
 - Checkers, Chess, Battleship, Jenga, Connect 4, Operation, Don't Break the Ice, Master Mind, Concentration (matching), etc.
 - Be careful of declaring "champions" with younger Scouts
- Team Jeopardy or Trivia
- 1:1 games by team (e.g. Jenga or Connect 4)
- Older Scouts may like more challenging games
 - Catan, Avalon, Risk, Ticket to Ride, Sequence, etc.

RE-CHARTERING

The council re-charter deadline was November 15th! If your unit's re-charter has not been completed, it is late, which can cause issues at the beginning of 2023, including:

- Not being covered by BSA Insurance
- Advancement can not be recorded at the National Office
- Delays in Scouts' Life Subscriptions

Re-charters MUST be completed as soon as possible, before 12/31!

Your unit's Annual Charter Agreements must be signed and returned to the Council office no later than **December 31st**, **2022!**

- Units Initiated but Not Complete: C1620, Ship 1822, P4, P7, P22, P34, P38, P41, P66, P105, T1B (Hingham), T4, T7, T9, T22B, T22G, T49, T53, T199, T4480
- Annual Charter Agreement Form is needed from ALL Charter Organizations
 Six completed as of 12/2/2022 (must be signed by executive officer, COR, CC and Council)
 Unit COR's and CC's were emailed instructions for the Annual Charter Agreement
 Were these received and recognized?
 They could:
 - 1. Ask for forms to be mailed to be forwarded and signed
 - 2. Ask for an electronic version to be signed by Adobe Verified Sign, this link would go to executive officer, once signed would go to COR (but Unit needs to supply emails for executive officer and COR)
 - 3. Ask for a .pdf for to be mailed to CC to be "walked around" for signature
- All units were assigned a Mayflower Staff Member for follow up, recommend contacting your staff member if unsure of status
