December 2018

Thanks for a Strong Year of Training

Please join us in a big "thank you" to...

- More than 300 adult leaders in our council who took the time to take in-person position-specific or supplementary training during 2018.
- Many more who took position-specific training online.
- All of you who sent your youth leaders to courses like NYLT, Den Chief training, and Venturing ILSC.
- Nearly 70 leaders who volunteered their time as trainers in 2018.

Our goal for 2019: Let's get even more leaders trained! It's an investment that pays off for every youth we serve.

Registration Open for Wilderness First Aid: Don't be Left Out!

Registration is now open for wilderness and remote first aid (WRFA). We're offering it four times in early 2019:

- · January 12-13 at Nobscot Reservation
- February 9-10 at Camp Squanto
- March 9-10 at Nobscot Reservation
- April 6-7 at Camp Squanto

This 16-hour course is for adults and youth age 14+. It will provide a Red Cross certification that's good for two years. You can also use this course to recertify. If you're leading a high-adventure trip next year, please plan to attend! If you wait until mid-April, you'll end up having to find a course somewhere else, likely at a higher price.

Each course will be capped at 20 participants, so sign up online (www.mayflowerbsa.org/events) as soon as you can to reserve your spot. You need current CPR certification in order to attend (see courses at right).

Intro to Backpacking

Are you interested in boosting your backpacking skills to prepare for an upcoming trek? Pencil in the last weekend in April—we're working on developing a new course that will provide ample hands-on learning to build your skills and confidence to move beyond car or trailer camping.

Heads-Up About Online Training

The BSA will update the online position-specific training courses for Cub Scout and Boy Scout (Scouts BSA) leaders on January 2. If you're partway through the modules for your position, finish them in December! Partial progress will not carry over to the new version. If you've already finished, there's no need to worry.

Youth Protection Training (YPT)

The BSA released a new YPT program in February '18. All registered adults must take this version of YPT in order to stay registered as a leader in 2019. If you haven't done it yet, time is running out! Please go to https://my.scouting.org/ and take it today. GENERAL INFORMATION

The District Award of Merit is a council award presented by districts in the same manner that the Silver Beaver is a national award presented by councils.

The award is available to Scouters who render service of an outstanding nature at the district level.

The award is made available annually on the basis of 1 for each 25 traditional units or fraction thereof. The district need not present all the awards to which it is entitled each year.

It is not appropriate to nominate a Scouter who has already received this award.

A professional Scouter or other council employee may not receive this award based on employment service. However, a professional Scouter or employee who also serves as a volunteer Scouter may be eligible, based on *volunteer* service.

REQUIREMENTS

- 1. A nominee must be a registered Scouter.
- 2. A nominee must have rendered noteworthy service to youth in Scouting, outside Scouting, or both.
 - Note: The nature and value of "noteworthy service to youth" may consist of a single plan or decisions that contributed vitally to the lives of large numbers of youth or it may have been given to a small group over an extended period of time.
- Consideration must be given to the nominee's Scouting position and the corresponding opportunity to render outstanding service beyond the expectations of that Scouting position.
- 4. The nominee's attitude toward and cooperation with the district and/or council is to be taken into consideration.
- 5. Nominations cannot be considered for posthumous awards.

PROCEDURE

- 1. Annually, district chairmen will appoint a temporary special District Award of Merit committee of not more than five persons who will consider all candidates and make recommendations of those to receive the award to the council through the Scout executive.
- 2. The Scout executive will inform the district chairman of those nominations approved by the council committee.
- 3. The following procedure is suggested for such presentation ceremonies:
 - a. The recipient and spouse should be in attendance at the annual meeting or recognition dinner.
 - b. A district and/or council officer should explain the award and its significance.
 - Eagle Scouts or Silver Award Venturers should be asked to escort the recipients to a place of honor at the head table or on stage.
 - d. A suitable citation for each recipient should be read indicating what each has done in Scouting.
 - e. The award (certificate, No. 33719; plaque, No. 17565; and lapel pin, No. 17551) may be presented at this time with appropriate congratulations.
 - f. The only uniform insignia which accompanies this award is an embroidered overhand knot, No. 05013.
 - g. A group picture may be taken for use in neighborhood or community newspapers (district responsibility).
