Unit Commissioner

The unit commissioner is a Scouting generalist whose passionate overriding mission in Scouting is to help units better serve more youth through scouting.





UNIT COMMISSIONER JOB DESCRIPTION

- The role of a unit commissioner (UC) is to provide support and information to unit leaders so they can deliver a high-quality program that attracts and retains youth and adults.
- Whether working with a pack, troop, crew, ship, club or post, unit commissioners are key to ensuring units have the necessary resources to provide a quality program for their youth.
- This is a one-year position that is renewable annually.



Roundtable Commissioner



- Roundtable commissioners are responsible for the monthly Roundtable in the district.
- When skillfully executed, the roundtable experience will inspire, motivate, and enable unit leaders to provide a stronger program for their youth.
- There are two main purposes of Roundtables.
- First, to provide the skill to do skills, techniques, information, program ideas the know-how that makes for a successful unit.
- Second, to provide unit leadership with the will to do the morale, enthusiasm, inspiration, and vision that periodically renews the desire to serve youth.

The Invitation Manager system in my.scouting.org can be a great tool for your unit's recruitment efforts.

In this workshop, you will learn:

- Overview of how Invitation Manager works
- Ways to use Invitation Manager as a way to track leads from recruitment events
- Best practices for responding to leads
- How to follow up effectively with a lead to keep them interested
- How to automatically send an online application
- Why one reply alone is not effective

3 EASY STEPS FOR COMPLETING ONLINE ADULT APPLICATIONS

Adult applications can now be submitted online through your unit PIN on BeAScout.org! *Please have applicants follow these 3 steps in order* to ensure that your Adult Applications can be processed easily:

STEP 1: Have applicant take and complete required Youth Protection Training on **my.scouting.org**

- They should write down the Scout ID assigned to them...they will need it as part of Step 3!
- Upon successful completion, they will receive an email with a certificate

STEP 2: Applicant should complete a Massachusetts CORI Form (Can be done online using the QR Code or go to **mayflowerbsa.org/membership**



STEP 3: Have Applicant complete the Online Adult Application using your unit's **BeAScout.org** PIN

 When they are asked if they have a my.scouting.org account, they will need their Scout ID to avoid having multiple accounts

Mayflower Adventure Boxes

Everything you need to complete an adventure in one box!

- Boxes are available for rent directly from the Mayflower website
- 3 Belt Loop or Pin options per rank
- Each \$20 rental is mailed to the leader's house with a return shipping label to return to the council office by the end of the 2-week rental period
- Inside is a list of items to keep and items that must be returned
- Each kit will include supplies for up to 10 scouts
- Once you have completed the adventure:
 - Repackage the returnable items in the original package
 - Attach the return label
 - Drop off at your local shipping location
