

- What Invite non-Scouting friends (or families) to join Pack/Troop/Crew/Ship for an afternoon or evening of fun
- Why "Dynamic Recruitment" look for ways to invite new members all year long
- When Any convenient time Winter activities offer opportunity sled/toboggan, build snow people, snow clearing service project, etc. Even an indoor "game night" can work
 - "Short Notice" can work IF unit prepares in advance who to invite and how to invite them
- Where LOCAL, avoid travel distances to maximize participation
- Goal Get friends and families to see <u>YOUR UNIT HAS FUN!</u>





- Leading a successful unit is a TEAM EFFORT
- "One-Person Show" won't last long
- Leaders must be RECRUITED
 - Direct personal ask vs. group "please help"
- Position specific training
- Parent engagement key to retention & membership growth
- Establish and communicate specific unit goals
- BUILD IN FUN as a leadership team, not just in unit activities
- Recognize all team members
 - Recognition knots
 - Other ways (elaborate? Simple?)

Council Transformation Status Summary







- Problem: Inadequate Adult Volunteers at the District Level to maintain effectiveness
- Resolution: Move to "Council-Centric Single-District" organization
- Timing & Plans: move to single-district council organization on 1 May 2025
 - Existing Districts will be merged to form a single "Mayflower District"
 - Existing District Committees (activities, training, advancement, etc.) merged into single Mayflower District Committees
 - Current District Committee Chairs and Members still needed will function in new Mayflower District structure
 - New Social Media Group: "Mayflower Leaders Growing Leaders" will replace existing District Facebook Groups
 - Existing District Committee email addresses will be merge to new Mayflower District email for communication purposes
 - Commissioner structure reorganized to Council-Centric structure
 - Individual District Roundtables merged to single Mayflower Council Hybrid Roundtable through June, structure will be reevaluated for 2025-26 program year



BSA Multi-Unit Policy Reminder!

From the Guide to Safe Scouting

"Local council approval is needed for unit-coordinated overnight camping activities involving other units not chartered by the same organization. Units that wish to host events involving other units that do not share the same charter partner must have approval from their council. This includes events for packs, troops, crews, and ships from the same council; neighboring councils; the same territory; or other territory."

For Clarity:

Single Unit Events – No Permission Required
Multiple Units from the Same Charter Org – No Permission Required
Multiple Units from DIFFERENT Charter Orgs – Permission Required

What's the BSA Policy on Siblings Attending Events?

Cub Scouts is a family centric program and scouts are encouraged to participate in activities as a family.

What does this mean?

This means that, per the National BSA Guidelines and the Guide to Safe Scouting; parents and siblings are welcome to attend any pack level events or overnights including Pack Meetings, Campouts, and Council Level events like the Chuckwagon Derby or Halloween Fun Day. When attending events, siblings are the responsibility of their parents or guardians and should not interfere with the general program of the event.

Siblings cannot attend Webelos/AOL Den level overnight events, Troop events, Venturing, or Sea Scout Events unless the event is open to families and the community such as a Court of Honor or Volunteer event. Additionally, any sibling over the age of 18 must be a registered adult with BSA to attend any pack or council events.

Andrea Watson, National Director of Camping and Outdoor Programs, said it best!

"The Guide to Safe Scouting states 'Cub Scout camping is a family-centric program.'
