








The WOSM's current stated mission is "to contribute to the education of young people, through a value system based on the <u>Scout Promise</u> and <u>Scout Law</u>, to help build a better world where people are self-fulfilled as individuals and play a constructive role in society".


#### The Dream.

- World Jamboree's. 26 have been held.
- From 1937 until 1947 BP's dream was put on hold. The world was at war.
- Again in 1979. the Jamboree scheduled for Iran was cancelled.
- In 1929 the 3<sup>rd</sup> World Jamboree was held in Arrow Park, Birkenhead England. Attended by over 50,000 scouts. This is still the largest number of attendees at a World Jamboree.
- Jamboree's have been held in consecutive years 1987-1988 Australia, 1998 -1999 Chile & 2002-2003 Thailand. Australia & Chile (Southern hemisphere). Thailand (Summer heat) all three held in December and January






















#### **International Spirit Award**

#### International Scouter's Award



The <u>International Scouter's Award</u> encourages Scouters to broaden their involvement in Scouting through participation in world Scouting activities and recognizes Scouters for their contributions to world Scouting.

#### What is Messengers of Peace?

World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM) created Messengers of Peace in 2011, to encourage Scouts around the world to step up and do what they can to make the world a little better.

Messengers of Peace aims to promote a culture of peace and dialogue for mutual understanding, promote service initiatives led by Scouts, support the development of young people affected by conflict situations, provide further connection to the UN's Sustainable Development Goals and connect Scouts around the world in a global network of 20 million Messengers of Peace.

## INTERPRETER STRIP

A Scout wearing the interpreter strip must be able to carry on a conversation in a foreign language or in sign language, write a letter in the foreign language (not required for signing), and translate orally and in writing from one language to another.







#### Background check update



- The BSA requires criminal background checks (CBC) for all Scouting leaders. The check is administered by a nationally recognized third party that also provides the service to many other institutions.
- As of the implementation date, the check <u>must be complete BEFORE</u> the adult can act in a Scouting Leadership role.
  - When the application is completed online, it goes to "pending" status
  - Individual and key 3 receive email that the individual can't act in a leadership role until the CBC is complete
  - Upon successful completion, individual is registered, emails are sent and they can be an active leader
  - If CBC shows a problem, there is a review process for clearance or denial
- IMPACT: Time frame for leader registration will be longer
- Implementation date 3/1/2024

#### District Award of Merit Nomination (nominations due Mar. 1)



- The District Award of Merit (separate from the awards on the previous slide) is a Council Award presented by Districts. The award is available to Scouters who render service of an outstanding nature at the district level. Districts may present 1 award for every 25 units.
- Award nomination is made using the National Form, which must be downloaded, completed, scanned and emailed.

#### Mayflower Council is CampDcc using CampDoc for all events!

The Mayflower Council is now using CampDoc instead of paper medical forms at all Council-level events! The CampDoc platform will reduce check-in time at events and makes it easier to register for Council events through BlackPug.

## National Membership Fee Changes & Council Activity Fee Changes

Effective **March 1, 2024**, the BSA will eliminate the \$25 one-time joining fee for new program participants in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouting.

- \$85/yr for Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouting participants (\$5 increase)
- \$65/yr for all adult volunteers (\$5 increase)
- \$30/yr for Scoutreach (No change in fee)
- \$25/yr for Merit Badge Counselors (No change in fee. Only for Merit Badge Counselors not already registered as leaders)
- \$50/yr for Exploring participants Youth & Adult (No change in fee)
- \$100/yr unit renewal/affiliation fee (No change in fee)
- \$15/yr for Scout Life magazine (No change in fee)
- <u>Council Program Fee</u> will remain at \$48 for Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouting participants until July 31, 2024 and then will increase to \$68 on August 1, 2024.





## New Requirements Regarding Background Checks!

## A criminal background check must be completed before new leaders can participate as an active adult leader beginning March 1, 2024.

The BSA requires criminal background checks for all Scouting leaders. The background checks are administered by a nationally recognized third party that also provides this service to many local, state and federal governments; educational institutions; and other nonprofits.





## UPDATE TO THE BARRIERS TO ABUSE Effective September 1, 2023

As part of our ongoing commitment to abuse prevention, the BSA has updated the adult supervision requirements for overnight activities.

### Effective 9/1/2023

- The "72-Hour Rule" was eliminated.
- All adults staying overnight in connection with a Scouting activity must be currently registered in an adult fee required position as listed or as an adult program participant.
- Limited exception: Cub Scout parents or legal guardians taking part in an overnight Cub Scout program with their own child or legal ward are not required to register as leaders.

## Policy Reminder GoFundMe and Similar Platforms

Did you know, BSA does allow for the use of 3<sup>rd</sup> Party fundraising platforms like GoFundMe to raise money for Eagle Scout projects.

However, the fundraiser needs to be organized/run under the Tax ID information of the beneficiary group for tax purposes or your scout can be held liable.

Your scout should NOT use: their own ID, their parent's ID, the Troop's Tax ID, or the Charter Org (unless the CO is also the beneficiary) for their GoFundMe fundraiser.

## 3 EASY STEPS FOR COMPLETING ONLINE ADULT APPLICATIONS

Adult applications can now be submitted online through your unit PIN on BeAScout.org! *Please have applicants follow these 3 steps in order* to ensure that your Adult Applications can be processed easily:

**STEP 1:** Have applicant take and complete required Youth Protection Training on **my.scouting.org** 

- They should write down the Scout ID assigned to them...they will need it as part of Step 3!
- Upon successful completion, they will receive an email with a certificate

**STEP 2:** Applicant should complete a Massachusetts CORI Form (Can be done online using the QR Code or go to **mayflowerbsa.org/membership** 



**STEP 3:** Have Applicant complete the Online Adult Application using your unit's **BeAScout.org** PIN

 When they are asked if they have a my.scouting.org account, they will need their Scout ID to avoid having multiple accounts



## What's the BSA Policy on Siblings Attending Events?

Cub Scouts is a family centric program and scouts are encouraged to participate in activities as a family.

#### What does this mean?

This means that, per the National BSA Guidelines and the Guide to Safe Scouting; parents and siblings are welcome to attend any pack level events or overnights including Pack Meetings, Campouts, and Council Level events like the Chuckwagon Derby or Halloween Fun Day. When attending events, siblings are the responsibility of their parents or guardians and should not interfere with the general program of the event.

Siblings cannot attend Webelos/AOL Den level overnight events, Troop events, Venturing, or Sea Scout Events unless the event is open to families and the community such as a Court of Honor or Volunteer event. Additionally, any sibling over the age of 18 must be a registered adult with BSA to attend any pack or council events.

Andrea Watson, National Director of Camping and Outdoor Programs, said it best!

"The Guide to Safe Scouting states 'Cub Scout camping is a family-centric program.' (see https://www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/gss/gss03/)

Siblings are part of a family."
