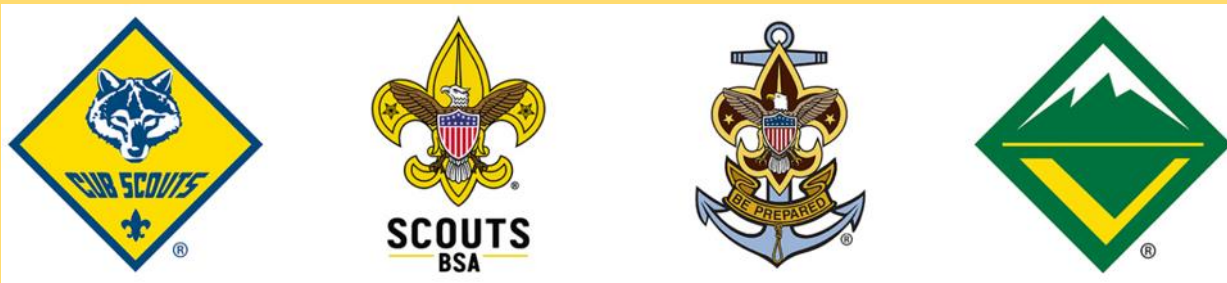

Measuring Success

- Each unit (Pack, Troop, Crew, Ship) is unique, due to the character, desires, abilities and dedication of its Leaders, Parents, and Scouts
- It's important to know
 - How YOUR program “stacks up” against BSA standards
 - How well YOUR program plan and execution meets the expectation of your Leaders, Scouts and Parents
 - Where Your program has strengths to build on (and perhaps share with other units) and where you have opportunities for improvement





2 Important Questions

1. How well are you delivering the Scouting Program?
2. Are your Scouts (and parents) having an excellent experience?

 - Leader Training

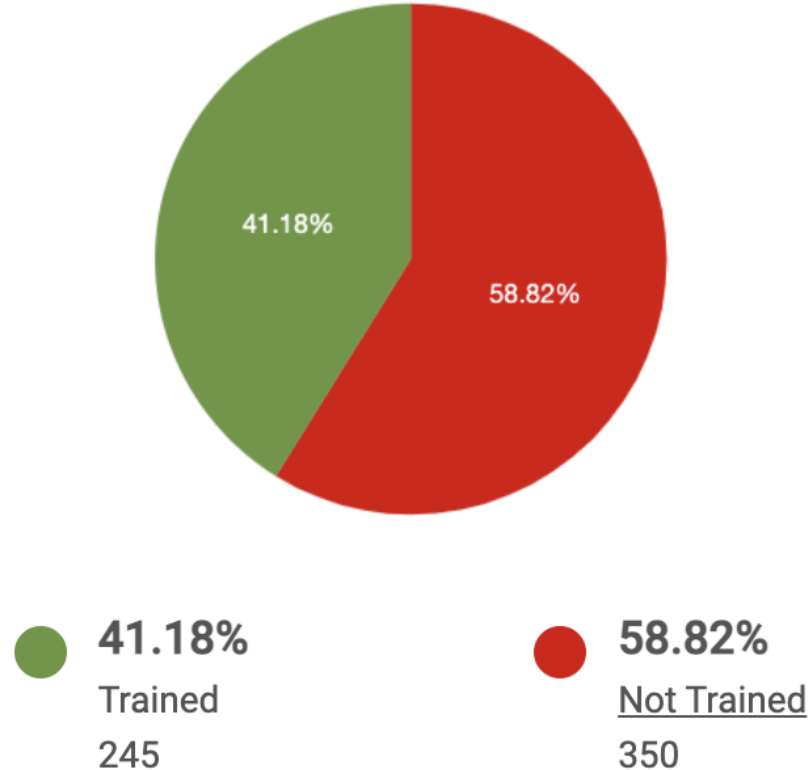

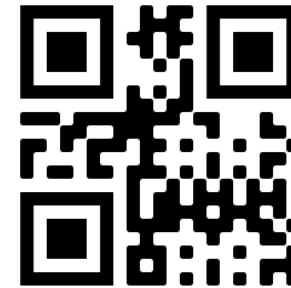


2022 Popcorn Fundraiser

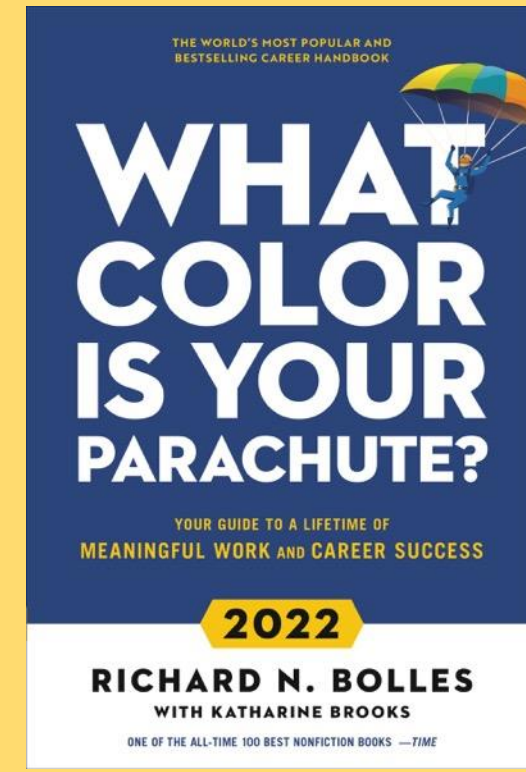

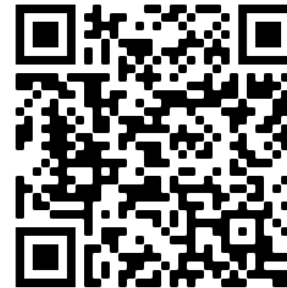

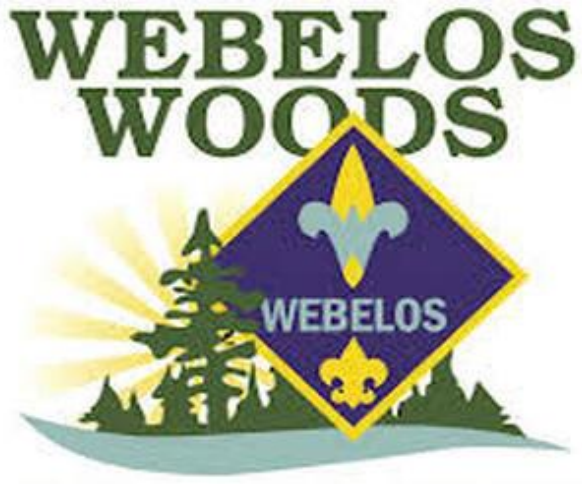
