Safety Moment: **Food Allergies**

- ~ 1 in 13 children has a food allergy
- Food allergy reaction results in ER visit ~ every 3 minutes
- Initial food allergy reactions can occur at any time
- Food allergy is not same as food intolerance
- Common food allergens are milk, eggs, peanuts, tree nuts, soy, wheat, fish, shellfish and sesame seeds



Key Responsibilities

- Know your Scouts (AHMR)
- Review issues with parents
- Plan to avoid known allergens, or provide safe separation – beware of cross contamination
- Have a response plan as needed



Upcoming District Leadership Structure Changes

- Challenge: Difficulty identifying adequate adult volunteers to fill key district positions – many district positions unfilled in Mayflower Council
- Action taken: Last summer, a committee determined best course of action is to move to a more council centralized support structure
- Implementation team is collecting information and identifying next steps in transition.
 - Roll-out plan being developed
 - Step-wise transition through the 2024-2025 program year
 - Council "Summit" meeting planned for Oct. 2024 participation welcome

 - *** Continued involvement of current leaders, and recruitment of others, will be a critical element as we move forward ***



Questions from prior sessions



Q: Can a Pack have den chiefs from a troop with a different charter organization and if so, can the den chief camp with the Pack?

A: Waiting clarification from BSA National

Q: With the new registration policy for adults (completion of the national background check before approval) what is the effective date of registration for the adult

A: The date the application is approved following the background check completion. Q: Can a Scouts BSA unit conduct a "family overnight event" (e.g., a ski trip including an overnight stay, overnight at a rock climbing gym, etc.)

A: Only registered members of the troop can attend the overnight portion. Families can meet them for the day event, but cannot stay overnight with the troop.

Q: How should a Scouts BSA unit register and insure a trailer?

A: All property is owned by the charter organization, and as such a trailer should be registered and insured by the charter organization. The troop can arrange to reimburse the charter organization for associated costs.

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New Requirements Regarding Background Checks!

<u>A criminal background check must be completed before new</u> <u>leaders can participate as an active adult leader beginning</u> <u>March 1, 2024.</u>

The BSA requires criminal background checks for all Scouting leaders. The background checks are administered by a nationally recognized third party that also provides this service to many local, state and federal governments; educational institutions; and other nonprofits.



Mayflower Council isCampDCusing CampDoc for allevents!

The Mayflower Council is now using CampDoc <u>instead of paper medical</u> forms at all <u>Council-level events</u>! The CampDoc platform will reduce check-in time at events and makes it easier to register for Council events through BlackPug.

National Membership Fee Changes & Council Activity Fee Changes

Effective **April 1, 2024**, the BSA will eliminate the \$25 one-time joining fee for new program participants in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouting.

- **\$85/yr** for Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouting participants (\$5 increase)
- **\$65/yr** for all adult volunteers (\$5 increase)
- **\$30/yr** for Scoutreach (No change in fee)
- \$25/yr for Merit Badge Counselors (No change in fee. Only for Merit Badge Counselors not already registered as leaders)
- **\$50/yr** for Exploring participants Youth & Adult (No change in fee)
- **\$100/yr** unit renewal/affiliation fee (No change in fee)
- **\$15/yr** for Scout Life magazine (No change in fee)
- <u>Council Program Fee</u> will remain at \$48 for Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouting participants until July 31, 2024 and then will increase to \$68 on August 1, 2024.

Policy Reminder GoFundMe and Similar Platforms

Did you know, BSA does allow for the use of 3rd Party fundraising platforms like GoFundMe to raise money for Eagle Scout projects.

However, the fundraiser needs to be organized/run under the Tax ID information of the beneficiary group for tax purposes or your scout can be held liable.

Your scout should NOT use: their own ID, their parent's ID, the Troop's Tax ID, or the Charter Org (unless the CO is also the beneficiary) for their GoFundMe fundraiser.

3 EASY STEPS FOR COMPLETING ONLINE ADULT APPLICATIONS

Adult applications can now be submitted online through your unit PIN on BeAScout.org! *Please have applicants follow these 3 steps in order* to ensure that your Adult Applications can be processed easily:

STEP 1: Have applicant take and complete required Youth Protection Training on **my.scouting.org**

- They should write down the Scout ID assigned to them...they will need it as part of Step 3!
- Upon successful completion, they will receive an email with a certificate

STEP 2: Applicant should complete a Massachusetts CORI Form (Can be done online using the QR Code or go to **mayflowerbsa.org/membership**



STEP 3: Have Applicant complete the Online Adult Application using your unit's **BeAScout.org** PIN

• When they are asked if they have a my.scouting.org account, they will need their Scout ID to avoid having multiple accounts

What's the BSA Policy on Siblings Attending Events?

Cub Scouts is a family centric program and scouts are encouraged to participate in activities as a family.

What does this mean?

This means that, per the National BSA Guidelines and the Guide to Safe Scouting; parents and siblings are welcome to attend any pack level events or overnights including Pack Meetings, Campouts, and Council Level events like the Chuckwagon Derby or Halloween Fun Day. When attending events, siblings are the responsibility of their parents or guardians and should not interfere with the general program of the event.

Siblings cannot attend Webelos/AOL Den level overnight events, Troop events, Venturing, or Sea Scout Events unless the event is open to families and the community such as a Court of Honor or Volunteer event. Additionally, any sibling over the age of 18 must be a registered adult with BSA to attend any pack or council events.

Andrea Watson, National Director of Camping and Outdoor Programs, said it best!

"The Guide to Safe Scouting states 'Cub Scout camping is a family-centric program.' (see <u>https://www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/gss/gss03/</u>)
