

Safety Moment: Campfire Safety



As described in March 2025 issue of Scout Life magazine on page 20 (a highlight of Camp Squanto was also featured on page 16, if you missed it), the article: "Put it out cold" reminds us that people cause 80% of wildfires, some from unattended campfires.

- Understand the local campfire regulations or requirements.
- Beware of current fire conditions, especially if it has been dry and windy.
- Check for any active burn ban.
- Use established campfire ring, if available, and keep your campfire size appropriate.
- Minimum of 15 feet from tents, shrubs, trees or other flammable objects. Check for low-hanging branches above.
- Store matches, lighters, & fire starters in secure waterproof box or bag outside your tent.
- Additives to the fire are prohibited.
- Extinguish campfires properly. Ensure campfires are completely cold-out. Do a test on cooled ash for any sign of heat before you consider the fire extinguished.

As Smokey Bear says, "only you can prevent forest fires."

Why: Being a Scout Leader is not a "Forever" job – circumstances & family commitments change.

- "Be Prepared" for unplanned changes.
- Filling vacant positions can be stressful succession plan helps
- Units can fail when leaders suddenly depart

When: NOW & Always! Regularly identify potential new leaders. Create a culture of volunteering

How:

- Identify roles to be filled with timing, note the responsibilities
- Know who is available
- Determine skills & interests
- Ask for help (direct personal ask)
- Get commitment
- TRAIN!
- Thank and Recognize

Leader Succession Planning – How is your unit doing?



Annual Unit Planning





Why:

- Ensure to continuously provide and active and engaging Scouting experience
- Ensure resources are adequate
- Key resource when leadership changes occur

When:

- At least annually prior to start of program year
 - Early enough to allow gathering of needed resources, leadership, etc.
- Can be more often if desired, update as needed

How:

- Different for Packs, Troops, Crews/Ships (following slides)
- Know other schedules (charter organization, school, town, etc.)
- Know key Council/District events

Other Items:

- "Document" It
- Share the plan (Online? Written? Published calendar?)
 - Scouts, Leaders, Parents, Charter Organization
- Annual plan may be "broad brush" more detailed plans for near term

Goal: Keep everyone "on the same page" – written goals and deadlines

Annual Planning: Packs

- Parents and legal guardians work together with pack leaders to run the program. Program year generally follows the school year.
- Meetings and activities can incorporate Cub Scout Adventures Determine which Adventures are best suited for which months, based on your local resources and weather.
- Include other items of interest to the Scouts
- Don't forget to look at your district/council events too!
- Determine the cost of each activity think about the supplies needed, fees to attend events, and costs for snacks or food so that adequate budgets can be prepared.
- Re-evaluate Start Stop Continue







Annual Planning: Troops

- Planning is done by the patrol leaders' council, run by the senior patrol leader with help from the Scoutmaster. Patrol leaders consult with patrol members to help determine what types of activities the Scouts are interested in doing.
- Meetings and activities should help support Scout advancement and can be prioritized based upon the current needs of the Scouts in the troop.
- District/council events, as well as those at High Adventure Bases, should be considered.
- Annual planning meeting can also incorporate Introduction to Leadership Skills Training (ILST) for troops or other team-building activities. Troops may decide to hold these meetings more often than once per year.
- Re-evaluate Start Stop Continue



Annual Planning: Crews & Ships



Venturers and Sea Scouts take the lead when planning their activities, adult advisors help ensure plans follow safety guidelines.

Basic Steps applicable to all plans

- Define the specifics of the activity (who, what, where, when and why)
- Define the resources (the places, the supplies, the budget the how)
- Consider alternatives (ships and crews think big having a back-up plan helps to Be Prepared)
- Commit the plan to writing (taking notes ensures the details are shared and helps with participation)
- Promote the plan (Venturers and Sea Scouts sometimes have lots of activities to balance – promoting activities helps ensure participation)
- Implement the plan (reap the benefits of all that hard work to plan the activity)
- Re-evaluate Start Stop Continue



Council Transformation Status Summary





- Problem: Inadequate Adult Volunteers at the District Level to maintain effectiveness
- Resolution: Move to "Council-Centric Single-District" organization
- Timing & Plans: move to single-district council organization on 1 May 2025
 - Existing Districts will be merged to form a single "Mayflower District", Existing District Committees (activities, training, advancement, etc.) merged into single Mayflower District Committees
 - Current District Committee Members still needed in new District structure
 - New Social Media Group: "Mayflower Leaders Growing Leaders" will replace existing District Facebook Groups
 - Existing District Committee email addresses will be merge to new Mayflower District email for communication purposes
 - Commissioner structure reorganized to Council-Centric structure
 - Individual District Roundtables merged to single Mayflower Council Hybrid Roundtable through June, structure will be reevaluated for 2025-26 program year

Transporting Scouts Safely (Mar. National Reminder)





Safe transportation starts with responsible drivers who follow all traffic laws and Scouting policies. Every driver must:

- Hold a valid driver's license (not suspended or revoked).
- Be at least 18 years old (youth drivers are not permitted).
- Avoid distractions, including texting or using a phone while driving.
- Never drive under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or any impairing substances.
- Ensure all passengers wear factory-installed seatbelts and use appropriate car seats for younger Scouts.


