

BSA Recruiting Challenges 2020

- National BSA Bankruptcy Implications
 - "Bar Date" advertising Sep. 1 to Oct. 16
 - Continued legal advertising through Nov. 16
- Units ceased "normal" activities mid March
 - Current level of engagement/interest?
- Pandemic situation
 - "Quarantine fatigue"
 - Fall restrictions??
 - Meeting size/location situation?





Prepare for 2020 Recruiting - 1



- Contact Leaders
 - How are they doing?
 - Build commitment to move on in the fall
 - Set up planning sessions
 - Plan fall program, WITH ALTERNATIVES
- Contact Scouts & Parents Show concern
 - How are they doing?
 - "Our Pack Activities Will Continue"
 - Seek help
- Recruit (retain) New Member Coordinator (NMC)
 - Ensure role understood and accepted
 - Encourage NMC Basic Training Online
 - · Respond to invitation "Leads" by email

#2 – GO DIGITAL

- FULLY set up Be A Scout Pin
 - Key-3 & "plus 3" have access
 - My.scouting.org: Organization Manager
 - Correct contact information
 - Create Pack Introductory Email (including pack fees and explanation)
 - Review content of National "Welcome to Scouting" email
 - Meeting location and schedule
 - Review Map View
 - Reference to Facebook page/website
 - Enable Request Information & Apply Now buttons for youth
 - No Electronic Applications for Adults in MA due to CORI requirement
 - National & Council fees paid by credit card only (through this charter period)
 - Some site changes coming Aug. 1, check the "look" after

- #2 GO DIGITAL, continued
- Verify Scoutbook records and access
 - Your communication tool
 - Parents connected?
 - Den Leader Experience?
 - Encourage continued advancement
 - Free virtual day camp?
- Verify readiness for Invitation Manager and Application Manager
 - Set access (Key-3, NMC, Designees)
 - Review screens for your unit







- #3 Plan a "normal" fall BUT include contingencies
- Meeting location access?
 - Pack and Dens
- Get "Up to Speed" on virtual meeting methods and ideas
 - Commissioners virtual method resources: https://www.scouting.org/commissioners/starting-sustaining-and-growing-units/virtual-scouting-faq-for-commissioners/
 - BSA Scouting at Home site: https://www.scouting.org/scoutingathome/

 - Internet search ideas on Pinterest, Facebook, many others
- Anticipate & prepare for new parent questions
 - Safety plans if in-person meeting OK (follow guidelines for schools)
 - Virtual plans if in-person not OK

- #4 Set up for recruiting event
- Promote BSA's Family Fun Fest, Aug. 8 11 AM: https://www.scouting.org/familyfunfest/
 - An "introduction to Scouting open house", open to all on Facebook live
- Plan advertising to promote YOUR pack:
 - Check with parents connections?
 - Chartering Organization?
 - Local troop's connections
 - Websites & Social Media (Town? Schools? Libraries? etc.)
 - Local papers, "wickedlocal", Bulletin Boards
 - Signboards?
 - Testimonials, Letters to the Editor, Editorials?
- Prepare recruiting materials
 - Calendar (with contingencies)
 - Pack contacts, meeting information, etc.







#5 Recruiting Event(s?)


- Live Event
 - Neutral Location (avoid unintended "connection" message)
 - Council-wide event planned Sep. 12 (more to follow)
 - Help from troop?
 - Internet connectivity? (Immediate application, QR Code, etc.)
 - "Apply right from your phone"
- Virtual Event
 - Set up presentation multiple testimonials, sample activities, game?
 - Zoom stream to YouTube Live or Facebook Live
 - Helps provide some security
 - Don't record youth
- "Bring a Friend"
 - Live or Virtual
 - Incentivize Scouts
