Safety Moment: Wildfire Safety

Before a wildfire:

- Family emergency plan
- Emergency kit & skills
- Plan for campouts, know fire risks During a potential wildfire or a nearby wildfire
- Stay alert-what are the warnings
- Have a plan and evacuate immediately if needed
- Follow instructions for the safety of everyone
- Put the safety of the youth first

After a wildfire:

- Follow safety basics
- Follow guidelines: assist in clean up as needed,
- Stay healthy by ensuring safe drinking water, throw out any questionable foods, eat healthy, get enough sleep, and if needed, talk about your feelings

Unit Service: The role of Unit Commissioner as a Unit's best source of information and connection to Council Resources

Unit Service and Commissioners

- The history of the Commissioner Service extends back to the advent of the Scouting program in England in the early 20th century under Baden Powell and the original founders of the Scouting movement.
- The Commissioner Service both nationally and here in the Mayflower Council is undergoing a period of rapid change regarding how we engage and develop relationships with unit leaders.
- Commissioners are volunteers whose sole purpose is to be a liaison and helpful presence to unit leaders by coaching them to achieve goals that units develop themselves.
- O By meeting with and listening to unit leaders and reviewing certain primary metrics the Commissioner can help guide units to have a successful program.

The Culture of Unit Service

Is defined as the following:

Be the Heart

Scouting's units are its heart; its success is dependent on them; they deliver its program to youth. Commissioners support unit leaders in developing a safe, welcoming environment and delivering Scouting's program effectively. We exist to support Scouting's heart.

Build Relationships

Commissioners must develop relationships with the unit leaders they serve based on mutual respect, candor, and trust. Without that, the communication and collaboration required to effectively support units is impossible.

Change Lives

Scouting changes lives – of the youth it serves and the adults who support it (both volunteers and professionals). As they adopt Scouting's values, they become engaged citizens who strengthen our communities, nation, and world

The future of Unit Service Cont.

Over the past year the Mayflower Commissioner service in preparation for the May 1, 2025 move to a centralized single Mayflower District has organized a Commissioners Cabinet based on the following Commissioner Functions:

- Training and Recognition
- Registration and New Unit development
- Online tools
- Commissioner Communications
- Membership Standards team
- Unit Service (Field UC'S)
- Currently a single Hybrid Roundtable is offered giving leaders a chance to attend in person or take advantage of an online zoom link to attend virtually. This Roundtable takes place in Marshfield under the leadership of ACC Dennis Gleason and his team of Roundtable Commissioners. Thought is being given to developing a second geographic location to give additional opportunity to attend in person.

Future of Unit Service

- Nationally, Commissioners are changing how they interact with unit leaders.
 - The old system of scoring and assessing unit health was not consistent and did not help unit leaders.
- Mayflower Commissioners will now utilize the new system which has only recently been rolled out
 - We are no longer assessors but coaches using informed discussions which build relationships and are based on a set of objective unit metrics.
 - These metrics will help us determine which units MAY need help and in what areas they need to focus on
 - > This allows commissioners support specific unit needs

Metrics of Unit Vibrancy

As of 2/1/2025 the online Commissioners tools system was updated to reflect these metrics

- Are the Key leaders trained?
- Unit Size
- Has there been Membership Growth?
- Advancement of both youth and leaders?
- Outdoor Activities, type and frequency
- Youth retention

This is not meant to be a "grade", but rather to help the unit identify their strengths and help them be more successful in areas where they need help

Recent Progress

- We commissioned four new Unit Commissioners this year, but we would like to have at least one commissioner per unit or town.
- If you've been in Scouting and looking for your next great volunteer position, please contact us!
- Training for the new commissioner is through unit Connections Guides as well as Commissioner Colleges (held annually) to learn new skills and build upon them.




