

Keep these permissions with the unit health forms."</u>
 - Note: additional guidance will be issued if/when deemed appropriate
- Charter Organizations may impose other requirements ENSURE TO CHECK!
- Check for more restrictive local guidelines
- Units must ensure to follow ALL relevant guidelines



Reminder: Youth Protection Training and Hazardous Weather Training must be renewed EVERY 2 YEARS—Are you current?

- 21 of 556 (3.8%) registered Cranberry Harbors Scouters' YPT has expired as of Oct. 4
- 46 additional leaders WILL EXPIRE before Feb. 1, 2022 (total 12.1%)
- ALL registered adults must remain current on Youth Protection Training
- ALL direct contact leaders must remain current on Hazardous Weather Training





Charter Renewal 2.0 – Some items of note





- Approval done electronically using "Adobe Sign"
 - COR must be "tech savvy" enough to complete, or must assign a COR delegate who can
- Can upload files to the system (e.g. paper application), BUT CAN ONLY UPLOAD ONE FILE PER MEMBER
 - New Adults need Application, CORI, YPT, Gvt. ID, etc., so these must be loaded into a .zip file BEFORE uploading to the charter renewal system
 - One resource on .zip files: https://www.wikihow.com/Make-a-Zip-File, there are many others including YouTube videos

- Multiple "roster refresh" allowed
- Can mark adults as "multiple" where appropriate
- Can re-assign positions to adults (as long as they are currently on the roster) using "pencil tool" on their listing
- Credit Card (3%), eCheck (\$1.00) or pay at council options
 - Payment includes National and Council Activity Fees




Internet Advancements Landing Page







Charter Renewal 2.0 Process – What should Units do **NOW**?



- Ensure COR & IH have valid email addresses listed in my.scouting.org
 - Needed for electronic (Adobe sign) charter approval
 - Check with COR assign a delegate?
- Update rosters
- Ensure ALL adults (including COR) have YPT <u>current through Jan. 31, 2022</u> to prevent charter rejection
 - HIGHLY recommend renewing if expiring before Mar. 1, 2022 to preclude delay issues.
- Promptly process new applications (Use on-line application it is much faster!)
 - Unfortunately, due to MA CORI, adult applications must still be submitted on paper, but scan and transmit is fully acceptable!
- Ensure person who will process charter is key-3 or delegate



^{*}Registration is charged a yearly fee of \$72.00 or at a prorated rate of \$6.00 per person, per month (Exploring \$45.00 or at a prorated rate of \$3.75 per person, per month.) This is the fee to be a member of the Boy Scouts of America and it goes directly to the National Council. Youth & adult fees will be collected for the remainder of months in the year as indicated by their join date on the application.

Mayflower Council Activity Fee: is charged for all program participants in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing, Sea Scouts and Exploring. Adult volunteers are exempt from the Council Activity Fee.


New Member Joining Fee: there will also be a one-time \$25 joining fee for new program participants in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouts; however, there is no joining fee for Exploring participants, participants previously registered in any BSA program (must provide previous BSA ID number), those transferring from one program to another, or adult volunteers.

Council Activity Fee Waiver: the Mayflower Council is committed to ensure that no family is turned away due to financial constraints. The Mayflower Council has created the activity fee waiver program to provide financial assistance to deserving Scouts who would otherwise not be able to afford participating in Scouting. The Mayflower Council, in administering funds provided by concerned individuals, foundations, and others, will act as good stewards by offering careful judgment in providing program fee waivers and will act in complete confidence. ^{**}Activity Fee is charged at a yearly fee of \$36 or at a prorated rate of \$3.00 per youth member, per month. Adult leaders are exempt from the Activity Fee.

^{***}Adults the yearly fee of \$45.00 or at a prorated rate of \$3.75 per person, per month is for primary membership. A non-primary member is someone registered in more than one position (i.e. a leader in more than one unit or as part of a unit and also in a position on the district or council). The registration fee is only paid once. There is no registration fee for merit badge counselors.

^{****} Units reserve the right to charge an additional unit program fee, typically referred to as dues, to help offset the cost of running their unit.


