

Advancement Update



Cub Scouts can continue to work on their current den's advancement through July 31, 2020.

Council can grant extensions of time to complete rank requirements beyond the 18th birthday for the Eagle or 21st birthday for Summit or Quartermaster, Unit leadership must become familiar with the five tests under 9.0.4.0.

The P. R. Advancement team lead by Bryan Corrigan is working on this.

Ordering Advancement Online

During this time that Scout Shops are closed and a leader needs to purchase Rank advancement items, please use the following steps.

- 1. Unit Leader will email their Scoutbook Advancement report to NDCSupply.Orders@scouting.org
- 2. Please include contact phone number so that the Customer Service team member can contact for payment information.
- 3. Customer Service Rep will contact Unit Leader for credit card information, ship to and bill to address, and verify the correct Council along with the actual advancement needed.

All in-person training courses through the end of April have been canceled.

All registered participants have been notified at the email address they provided when they registered for the training. All fees have been refunded. No make-up dates have been scheduled at this time, given the uncertainty of how long it could take to get back to safe operations.

What Can I Do From Home?

- 1. Renew Youth Protection Training (YPT)! This twohour training expires every two years. If you've been registered as a leader for a while, chances are you took it in 2018 when the BSA made everyone take the new course. That means you need to retake it in 2020. Get it done! Visit https://my.scouting.org.
- 2. Take other position-specific training (PST) online. If you're a Cub Scout leader (any position), Troop Committee member, Merit Badge Counselor, or many other positions, you can complete basic training for your position at https://my.scouting.org. Every Scout deserves trained leaders!
- 3. Join us for a training webcast! We'll be announcing a series of webinars in early April, Some will be brand-new topics, like "Tips for Virtual Scouting." Others will be classroom courses that we are bringing online for interaction, Q+A, etc. Read the weekly council e-newsletter for updates!
- 4. Fix your training records! Some old courses may be missing, especially for longtime Scouters, Log into https://my.scouting.org to check your training completions. If something is missing, please contact your district training chair or the council training chair (see below, right side) to start. We generally ask for proof via certificate or course director confirmation.
- 5. Earn a training knot! See application forms with requirements at www.scouting.org/training/adult.aspx (scroll down to "Training Awards"). Forms can be signed electronically or scanned and emailed to awards@mayflowerbsa.org. From there, they'll be routed to your district training chair for approval.

Q+A: Training During the Pandemic

Q: Will online training still be available?

A: Yes, All BSA courses available through https://my.scouting.org are available as usual. If you happen to find extra time on your hands, now's a great time to take basic training for your position-or take a supplemental course to learn more! We're also planning a series of webcasts to provide additional options. They'll be announced in Mayflower Council's weekly enewsletter.

Q: I need BALOO to be able to take my Cub Scouts camping, but the April BALOO was canceled. How can I get this training?

A: We'll schedule BALOO as soon as it's safe to do so.

Q: My CPR and first aid certifications are about to lapse. What can I do to recertify?

A: Mayflower Council partners with the American Red Cross (ARC) to offer these courses. ARC has told us they'll offer a grace period of a few months on expiring certifications. We are also exploring what ARC will allow with respect to online learning. Mayflower Council will resume in-person training when it's safe to do so.

Q: I need Wilderness First Aid (WFA) because I'm leading a high adventure trek this summer, but the council's courses are canceled. What can I do?

A: Check with the high adventure base you're going to. For example, Philmont recently said they may accept recently expired certifications, but they're not waiving the overall WFA requirement at this point. We know this poses a challenge for anyone who was aiming to get WFA-certified for the first time. We will add a WFA/WRFA course to the calendar when it is safe to do so.

Page 2: In-Person Training We Offer

The success of every Scouting program depends on having well-trained leaders. They not only bring a quality program to their units, but they also have more fun doing it. Everything we do in Scouting has a purpose. Training is the key to recognizing, understanding, and achieving the purpose behind every activity. If you're a registered leader, there's a training course for you!

Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO)	A hands-on intro to outdoor skills for the Cub program, taught on an overnight campout. If your pack goes camping, at least one BALOO-trained adult must be there.	Cub Scout adults	1.5 days	2–3 times/year, spring and fall. Various camps.
Cub Leader Position-Specific Training (PST)	Classroom overview of the Cub Scouting program, advancement, leader roles, and resources to help you run a strong program. (Also available online.)	Cub Scout adults	4 hours	At least 4 times a year, mostly fall. Locations vary.
CPR/AED	American Red Cross certification in CPR and AED (defibrillator) use, valid for two years.	Adults and capable youth	3.5 hours	8+ times/year, often Nobscot or Canton.

Leave No Trace Trainer Training	Hands-on training in the seven principles of Leave No Trace and advanced camping methods.	Adults and youth 14+	2 full days	Spring and maybe fall at BSA camps.
National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT)	Advanced leadership development course for youth. Ideal for youth who aspire to Senior Patrol Leader, ASPL, or other key leadership positions.	Scouts BSA and Venturing youth	1 week	2 times each summer: Squanto and Resolute.
Red Cross First Aid	American Red Cross certification in basic first aid skills, valid for two years.	Adults and capable youth	3.5 hours	8+ times/year, often Nobscot or Canton.
Scoutmaster/ ASM PST	Fundamentals of running a successful youth-led troop, patrol method, and more. (Also available online.)	Scouts BSA adults	4–5 hours	6+ times/year. Locations vary.
Troop Committee PST	Learn how an effective Troop Committee can support a successful youth-led troop. (Also available online.)	Scouts BSA adults	2–3 hours	A few times/year. Locations vary.

Our in-person courses are organized and taught by trained volunteers who have been "in your shoes." Live training is a great way to meet fellow leaders, share ideas, get answers to questions, and get a chance to practice key skills. We try to offer these courses at a variety of times and locations, but we can also add certain courses on demand, if requested.

We offer other courses periodically, too. You can also take many training courses online at https://my.scouting.org. For most Scouting positions, online training covers all the requirements to be considered "trained" for your position and wear the https://my.scouting.org/. NOVEMBER 21, 2020 TREAD LIGHTLY! TRAINER COURSE

Tread Lightly! Trainer course is an 8-hour course designed to provide a "crash course" in outdoor ethics focusing on motorized and mechanized recreation on both land and water.

Participation in the course qualifies individuals to present the Tread Lightly! message to others in their state or region. Participants will work with Master Tread Trainer on understanding the role outdoor ethics play in the recreation community, learn the Tread Lightly! principles of responsible recreation and be provided with the tools to conduct workshops and coordinate community outreach.

The Tread Trainer Course requires active participation throughout the course. Successful candidates are provided with the tools to conduct awareness workshops and coordinate community outreach. Trainers receive Tread Lightly! Power Point presentations and training resources on a flash drive, certificate of completion, \$25 annually in free educational materials, an extra discount on all Tread Lightly! Materials and updates through a semi-annual newsletter, emails and website.
